## Area fisherman featured at show

Saline resident Don Miller, whose career as a fisherman on Lake St. Clair spans the last three decades, will be among those featured at the Ultimate Fishing Show at Rock Financial the Showplace in Novi Jan. 12-16 where he will present a seminar on the muskies of Lake St. Clair. Miller will speak on muskies' seasonal movements and their habits.

The fish can range in size anywhere from 20 to 60 pounds, with the age of these trophies being 15 to 32 years old, with a length of 45 to 56 inches, according to Miller.

Miller operates out of the Nautical Mile in Saint Clair Shores and is the owneroperator of Miller's "Motor City Muskies" Sportfishing, Inc. He operates a 30-foot fiberglass boat complete with state of the art electronics, and has "boated" more than 4,500 muskies out of Lake St. Clair. He has fished with people from 23 states and 10 different countries, as far east as Singapore and as far west as Germany.

"Some things are universal," Miller says, "and fishing is just one of them."

Miller has been a guest on numerous radio and TV shows, and has been endorsed by Musky Hunter, Field and Stream, Fishing Facts, and Michigan Out-of-Doors magazines. He has become one of the Great Lakes Region's most popular charters, and has proved to many that a muskie does not have to be a "once-in-a-life-
